

Stool collection




 Based on the type of tests your doctor prescribed, you will receive a tube with a blue cap as well as with one with a green cap. You may receive a single tube or several, differently coloured tubes.

The **liquid** contained in the tube with the green cap is important for the subsequent analyses – **please do not remove it.**




2. Avoid contact between the stool specimen and urine or water from the toilet.




3. Open the collection tube with the **blue cap.** Using the spoon attached to the cap, pick up a walnut-sized portion of stool.

Unscrew the tube with the **green cap,** insert the swab into the stool sample and rotate it until it's completely covered in fecal material.



4. Mix and mash the specimen with the liquid contained in the tube (green cap) until the sample is evenly dispersed. Put the swab back into the tube and break it at the marked breakpoint.

Recap the tube tightly (the spoon remains inside).



5. Write your name and the collection date of the specimen on the tube label. Place your filled tube and the filled form you received from your doctor into the bag. Seal the bag tightly.



Post the bag. Do not use mailboxes placed outdoors, since strong temperature fluctuations may damage the sample.

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
